We are primarily concerned with defining *Perfume* and *Cologne* and Alchemy's relationship to accepted terms of fragrance concentration. '*Cologne*' is more of a marketing term. It used to mean a specific fragrance profile, not "cheaper" or "for men".

At Alchemy, Perfume and Cologne are *styles* of fragrance defined by old rules: Colognes tend to be light, ephemeral and have lots of heart and top notes. While Perfumes are richer, fuller, more tenacious and have more base notes in the formula.
